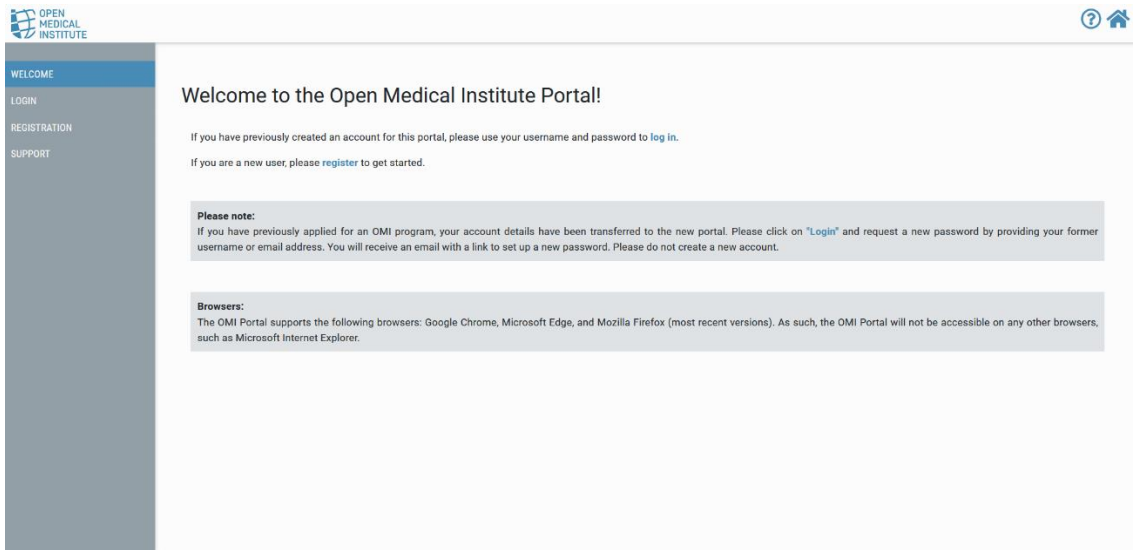

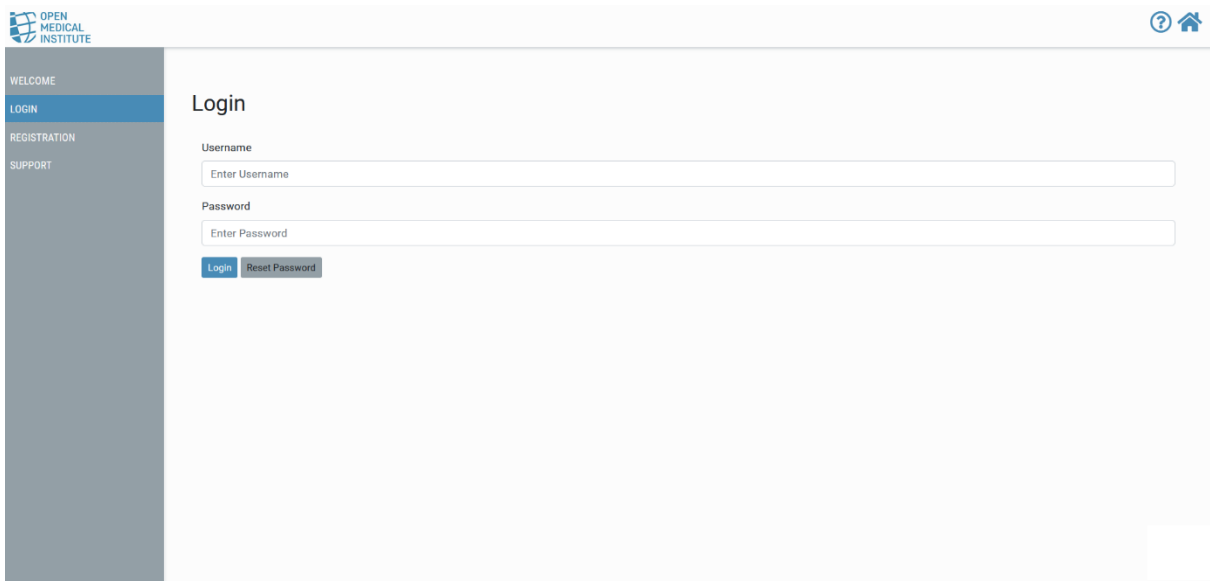

WELCOME TO THE OPEN MEDICAL INSTITUTE PORTAL!

The **Open Medical Institute (OMI)** is a global educational initiative. Established by the American Austrian Foundation (AAF) and doctors from Weill Cornell Medicine in 1993, it bridges the knowledge gap between East and West, North and South, and prevents brain drain from countries in transition.

The OMI operates under the auspices of the AAF and the Salzburg Stiftung der AAF and is co-funded by the Austrian Federal Ministry of Education, Science and Research, the Open Society Foundations, as well as corporate and individual donors.

OMI SEMINARS

The OMI seminars are the first step in the OMI's postgraduate educational program. The seminars are taught by physicians from leading American and European hospitals and their affiliated medical schools, and are directed to mid-career level, English speaking physicians practicing in Central and Eastern Europe, Asia, Africa, Latin America, and other countries in transition. The selection of applicants is based on open competition and merit. Once accepted, fellows are invited to Schloss Arenberg in Salzburg to participate in a one-week seminar, to meet with internationally renowned American and European faculty to exchange knowledge and experiences. Each seminar is limited to a maximum of 36 participants, allowing for intense interaction through lectures, discussions, case presentations, and hands-on trainings.

Seminar applications must be submitted online. It is only possible to apply for a maximum of four seminars per year. [Click here](#) to view details on the OMI seminar program and to apply online. The academic program of most OMI seminars is based on a two- or three-year curriculum. Please refer to the [curriculum](#) of your seminar topic before submitting your application in order to make sure that the topics being offered correspond ideally to your interests. OMI OBSERVERSHIPS, SATELLITE SYMPOSIA & VISITING PROFESSORSHIPS

Successful seminar participants are eligible for the OMI observership program. [Clinical observerships](#) last one month and can be repeated three times. [Research observerships](#) last three months and can also be repeated three times. [Satellite symposia](#) and [visiting professorships](#) are one to three-day educational activities in the fellows' home countries.




OMINARS

In 2020, the OMI launched highly interactive webinars, called OMinars. The first OMinars were created to bridge the gap of in-person seminars caused by COVID-19, but as they have proven to be an effective and interactive way to help essential medical knowledge reach doctors across the globe, they will continue after in-person seminars resume. Each OMinar lasts five to fifteen hours and
