

Wolfgang Aulitzky, MD is the Medical Director of the American Austrian Foundation. He is the Associate Dean of International Medicine and Distance Learning, Adjunct Professor of Clinical Urology, and Adjunct Professor of Clinical Reproductive Medicine at Weill Cornell Medicine. In 2016, he was appointed as an Adjunct Professor of Pediatrics in the Associated Faculty of the Perelman School of Medicine at the Children's Hospital of Philadelphia. He is also an Associate Professor of Urology at the Medical University of Innsbruck and a Visiting Professor at the Medical University of Vienna. Amongst others, he is a member of the American, German, and Austrian Societies of Urology and was awarded the Zuckerkandlpreis of the Austrian Society of Urology in 1989. He received the Silver Medal in 1995, the Golden Medal for Merits to the Republic of Austria in 2007, and the Cross of Honor of the Land Salzburg in 2014. As Director of the Medical Program of the American Austrian Foundation, he initiated the Open Medical Institute, a scientific and educational collaboration of Weill Cornell Medicine, Children's Hospital of Philadelphia, Duke University, Columbia University, Cleveland Clinic, and leading hospitals in Austria. Dr. Aulitzky earned his medical degree at the University of Innsbruck in 1977, was a research associate at the University of Uppsala, Sweden and Rockefeller University, New York. He received his education as a urologist at the University of Innsbruck and the General Hospital of Salzburg. He is the author of more than 140 publications on Urology, Andrology and Health Care issues, and is the coauthor of books on basic and clinical urology/andrology.

James M. Callahan, MD is a pediatric emergency physician at the Children's Hospital of Philadelphia (CHOP) and a Professor of Clinical Pediatrics at the Perelman School of Medicine (PSOM) of the University of Pennsylvania. He serves as Medical Director of CHOP's Global Pediatric Education program. He is a native of northern New York State and graduated from St. Lawrence University in Canton, NY and SUNY Upstate Medical University in Syracuse. He completed pediatric residency, served as Chief Resident, and was a fellow in Pediatric Emergency Medicine at CHOP. Dr. Callahan has served in a range of leadership roles in resident and fellow education including Director of Education for the Division of Emergency Medicine and Vice Director of the CHOP Pediatric Residency Program. He currently serves as the Education Officer for the Department of Pediatrics at PSOM. He has played a significant role in many global medical education activities long before assuming his current position, including hosting numerous international observers in the Emergency Department, serving as an invited speaker at numerous international conferences and symposia, and working with international stakeholders to support the activities of the Open Medical Institute of the American Austrian Foundation in Austria, Mexico, and Chile. Dr. Callahan is an Attending Physician in the Division of Emergency Medicine. He has authored several peer-reviewed articles and over twenty book chapters related to Pediatric Emergency Medicine. He has served as a member of the Committee on Pediatric Emergency Medicine of the American Academy of Pediatrics and of the Pediatric Emergency Medicine Sub -Board representing the American Board of Pediatrics. He is a reviewer for five refereed journals and serves on the Editorial Board for Pediatric Emergency Care. He served on the Guidelines Workgroup that authored the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's Guidelines on the Diagnosis and Management of Mild Traumatic Brain Injury Among Children. His current academic and professional interests include mild traumatic brain injury (concussions) in children and adolescents, prehospital care for children, improving the experience of patients, families and providers, and professionalism among medical trainees. As Medical Director of Global Pediatric Education, Dr. Callahan works to build and maintain long-term, collaborative relationships with international partners in global medical education, oversee international observers and scholars visiting CHOP, and works with departments, divisions, and faculty at CHOP to support and facilitate global medical education activities.
