Wolfgang Aulitzky, MD is the Medical Director of the American Austrian Foundation. He is Associate Dean for International Medicine and Distance Learning, Adjunct Prof. of Clinical Urology and Adjunct Prof. of Clinical Reproductive Medicine at the Weill Medical College of Cornell University/New York Presbyterian Hospital. In 2016, he was appointed Adjunct Professor of Pediatrics in the Associated Faculty of the Perelman School of Medicine at the Children's Hospital of Philadelphia. He is also Associate Prof. of Urology at the Medical University of Innsbruck and Visiting Professor at the Medical University of Vienna. Amongst others he is a member of the American, German and Austrian Societies of Urology and was awarded the Zuckerkandlpreis of the Austrian Society of Urology in 1989. In 1995 he received the Silver Medal, in 2007 the Golden Medal for Merits to the Republic of Austria and in 2014 the cross of honor of the Land Salzburg. As Director of the Medical Program of the American Austrian Foundation he has initiated the Open Medical Institute, a scientific and educational collaboration of Weill Cornell and the NewYork Presbyterian Hospital, the Children Hospital of Philadelphia, Duke University, Columbia University, the Cleveland Clinic and leading hospitals in Austria. Dr. Aulitzky earned his medical degree at the University of Innsbruck in 1977, was a research associate at the University of Uppsala, Sweden and the Rockefeller University, New York. He received his training as an urologist at the University of Innsbruck and the General Hospital of Salzburg. He is the author of more than 140 publications on Urology, Andrology and Health Care issues and is co-author of books on basic and clinical urology/andrology.

Jonathan A. Coleman, MD is a Urologic Surgeon at Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center in New York and specializes in minimally invasive and image guided therapies for urologic malignancies of the kidney, urothelium and prostate. Dr. Coleman received his degree in Medicine from Cornell University Medical College in 1996 followed by residency in General Surgery and Urology at The New York Hospital in New York City with E. Darracot Vaughan, MD. From 2003 – 2004 Dr. Coleman completed his Fellowship training in Urologic Oncology at the National Institutes of Health / National Cancer Institute (NCI) in Bethesda. Maryland including research on urothelial cancer and hereditary forms of kidney cancer with Marston Linehan, MD. He remained on staff at the NCI as Attending Surgeon and Senior Research Scientist where he continued his research work in c-MET expression and targeted inhibition under the mentorship of Don Bottaro, PhD. In 2006 Dr. Coleman was invited to join the faculty at Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center in New York where he a Professor of Urology in the Department of Surgery. Dr. Coleman has a special interest in the study of hereditary urologic cancer syndromes involving Renal Cell Carcinoma and Upper Tract Urothelial Cancer. His funded laboratory research activities include investigating genomic markers in urologic cancers and development of image guided minimally invasive surgery for the treatment of advanced urologic cancers of kidney, urothelium and prostate.

Joan Palou Redorta, MD, PhD, FEBU, FRCS (Glasg) is a world-renowned expert in Urooncology, mainly in bladder cancer and Robotic Surgery. He graduated from the Medical School of the Universitat Autònoma de Barcelona and became a urologist at the Hospital Vall d'Hebrón in Barcelona. He also spent some short periods of time at different centers in the USA during his residency training. He is a Professor of Urology at the Universitat Autònoma de Barcelona (Spain) and Chairman of the Urology Department at the renowned Fundació Puigvert in Barcelona. Dr. Palou is Ex-Chairman of the European School of Urology (2012-2021) where he broadened the academic activities with a lot of new educational programs (webinars, Uro-training, Masterclasses, Undergraduate, etc). In 2011, he became a member of the Association of Academic European Urologists (AAEU) and in 2016 member of the American Association of Genito-Urinary Surgeons (AAGUS). He is, among many others, a member of the Spanish Urological Association (AEU), European Association of Urology (EAU), American Urological Association (AUA) and Société International d'Urologie (SIU). Dr. Palou is an expert in laparoscopy and robotic surgery belonging to a cooperative group in robotic radical cystectomy. He has collaborated with the International Consultation on Bladder Cancer, Upper tract and Penile Cancer, sponsored by the WHO and SIU. He is involved in the IBCG (international Bladder Cancer Group) and the IBCN (International Bladder Cancer Network), developing landmark papers in bladder cancer. Most importantly, he has been involved in writing the EAU Guidelines for non-muscle invasive bladder cancer and upper urinary tract tumours. Dr. Palou has published many chapters in medical and urology books and more than 450 publications in peer-reviewed journals. His recent publications focus mainly on bladder cancer studying the different aspects such as prognostic factors, CIS, TURB, Re-TURB, En-bloc resection, BCG, cT1 G2 and G3 tumors, guidelines, risk stratification, urinary markers, muscle invasive disease and Upper Urinary tract tumors. In Robotic surgery, he has been working mainly in radical cystectomy, urinary diversion, RPLND and ureterointestinal stenosis. Some new protein markers of aggressiveness and prognosis of progression in patients with cT1G3 tumours of the bladder has been developed with the CNIO (National Center for Oncologic Investigations), Columbia University and with other European centers. He is also a referee of several national and international journals. He has given countless lectures in national and international meetings and as a visiting professor in University Hospitals all over the world. His group has received several awards for publications, videos, oral and poster presentations at different meetings. The most known is the Hans Marberger prize in 2004 and 2021. He was recognized with the Platinum Award of European Urology Journal in 2018 and the Shlomo Raz Award from the CAU in 2020.

Evangelos N. Liatsikos, MD, PhD, MBA is the new Chairman of the European School of Urology (ESU). He is a Professor of Urology and the Chairman of the Department of Urology at the University Hospital of Patras in Greece. He was elected as the Medical Director of the University Hospital of Patras in October of 2020. He is a Guest Professor at the University of Leipzig in Germany. He is an Adjunct Professor at the Medical University of Vienna, Austria and at the Institute for Urology and Reproductive Health, Sechenov University, Moscow, Russia. He was Chairman of the European Section of Uro-Technology (ESUT) from 2016 to 2020. He is distinguished in literature for his research in Laparoscopy and Endourology, with his work accounting for more than 300 international publications. Dr. Liatsikos has also been invited as a speaker and live surgeon in a series of the most prestigious urological congresses worldwide. For his scientific contribution, Professor Liatsikos was nominated for the "Arthur Smith Endourology Lectureship" award in 2009 by the World Association of Endourology. He also received the award of "Academic Endourology Fellowship Program Director" in November 2016 during the World Congress of Urology. In May 2022, he successfully completed a master's in business administration (MBA).

Mariano Sotomayor, MD is a urologist who has a special interest in urological oncology, andrology, and medical education. He was born in Morelia, Mexico where he graduated from medical school at the Universidad Michoacana de San Nicolas de Hidalgo. After graduation, he did residencies in Internal Medicine, Surgery, and Urology at the Instituto Nacional de Ciencias Medicas y Nutricion Salvador Zubiran, from 1987 to 1994. Afterwards, he went abroad and did clinical stays at the Fundacion Puigvert in Barcelona, Spain and at Harvard University in Boston, Massachusetts, USA. Later, he joined the Urology Department at his parent institution in Mexico City where he founded the Sexual Dysfunction Clinic and performed research in two main areas: andrology and urological oncology. He was also a professor of Urology at the Univesidad Nacional Autónoma de México and Universidad Panamericana. He also served as a member of the editorial committee of the Journal of Sexual Medicine and Revista de Investigacion Clinica. Dr. Sotomayor also worked in different administrative roles throughout the past years, such as the Presidency of the Mexican Society of Urology and is currently the President of the Mexican Board of Urology.


